

N60 and Tournament Team FAQ's

Huntley Little League is pleased to offer our programs for both baseball.

Q: What is N60?

A: N60 is a part-time travel baseball program offered by Huntley Little League.

Q: Why is it called N60?

A: The N60 program was initially started by local leagues that played north of Route 60 (near Gurnee, IL). N60 is an acronym that means ‘North of Route 60’. This program has since grown and expanded to include many more programs and leagues. The program has since changed its name to the Northern Illinois All-Star League (NIASL). However, it is still commonly referred to as N60.

Q: How does N60 work?

A: The N60 season is a separate season that is played in parallel to the regular Huntley Little League season.

Q: What is the purpose of the N60 program?

A: The N60 program is designed to prepare players for the Little League All-Star tournament team season. N60 teams are made up of the best players from different teams from the same Division within Huntley Little League. These players practice and play games together as an N60 team in order to prepare to play as the Little League All-Star team during the summer. Please note that N60 players remain together as a team during the Little League All-Star tournament season. This season begins after the regular spring season has ended. While N60 teams are not considered to be part of Little League International these teams are eligible to play in the Little League All-Star tournaments because the players are also required to play with their regular in-house spring teams.

Q: Can anyone participate in N60?

A: N60 teams are considered All-Star teams. Players must be selected to play on an N60 team.

Q: Are tryouts required for N60?

A: Generally speaking, yes. Depending upon the amount of players interested in each Division tryouts may be required.

Q: Does each Division offer an N60 team?

A: No. Generally speaking N60 teams begin play at age 9. The Divisions that have an N60 team varies each year depending upon player interest.

Q: Are all players who are interested in N60 placed on an N60 team?

A: No. Not everyone who tries out for an N60 team will be selected.

Q: Is N60 part of Little League?

A: No. N60 is not considered to be sanctioned by Little League International. However, Huntley Little League does participate in the N60 program.

Q: Can I play in both N60 and Little League at the same time?

A: Yes. In fact, all N60 players are required to play on their in-house spring team as well as their N60 team.

Q: How many games does an N60 team play?

A: Most teams play a 10 game season and one tournament.

Q: Is there an additional cost for the N60 program?

A: Yes. This additional cost is only paid if you are selected to play on an N60 team. The cost varies from year to year,

Q: How do I let someone know I am interested in participating in N60?

A: When you register for the spring season there is a checkbox you can select to indicate that you are interested in the N60 program. Please note that this checkbox is only meant to indicate that you may be interested. It does NOT mean you have or will be selected to play on an N60 team.
